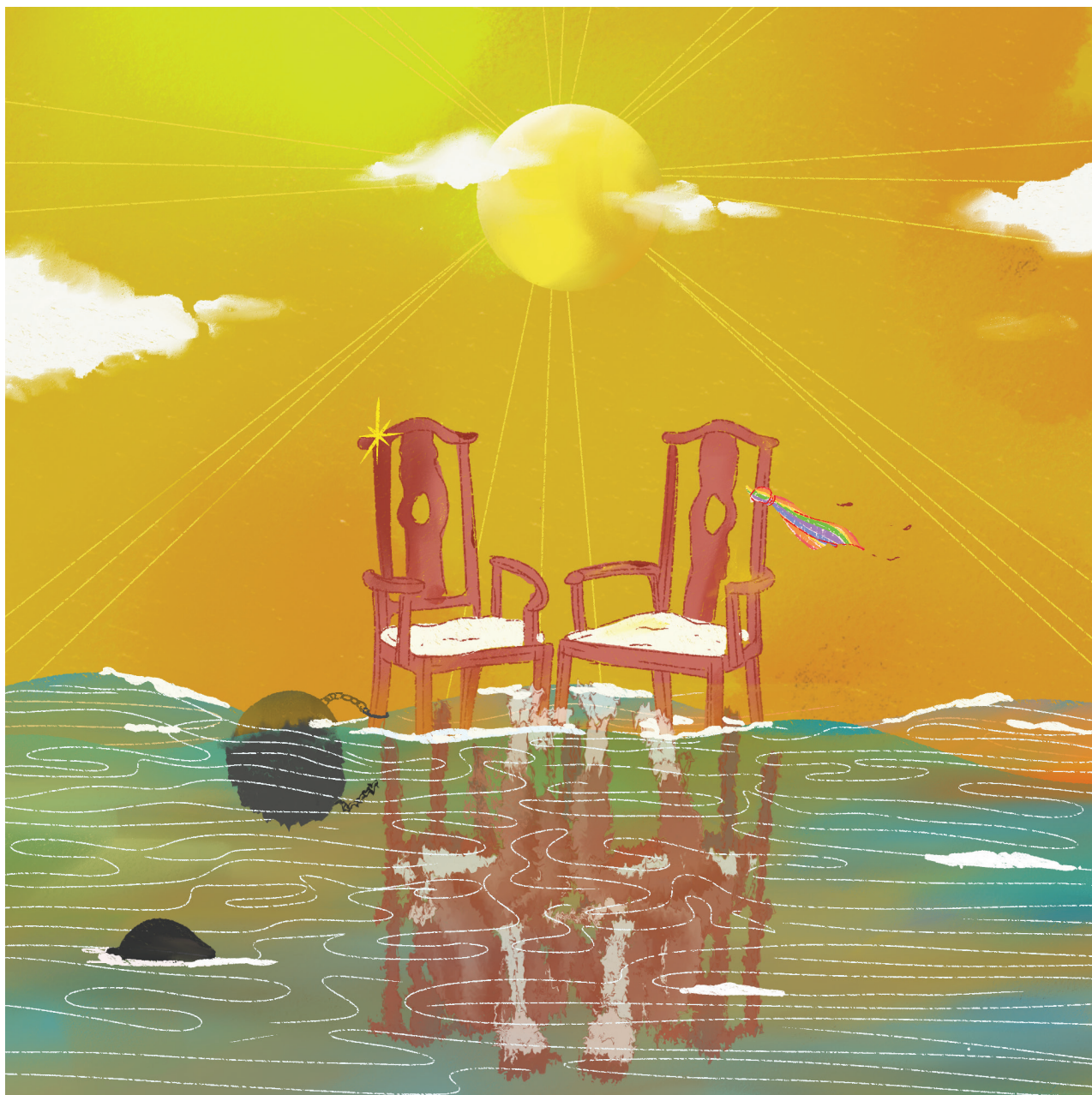
startled him. It wasn't even the sunglasses casually perched on my forehead or the multitude of rings decorating my fingers. It was something deeper, something more profound.

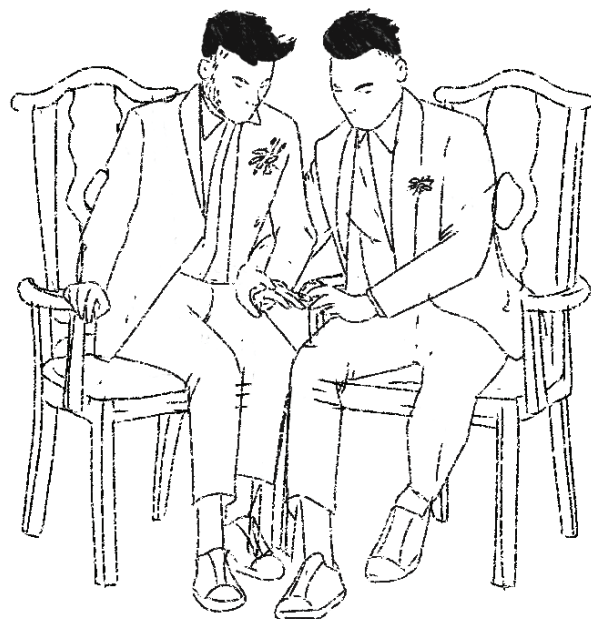
In Pairs | Redefining Connections in a Diverse World

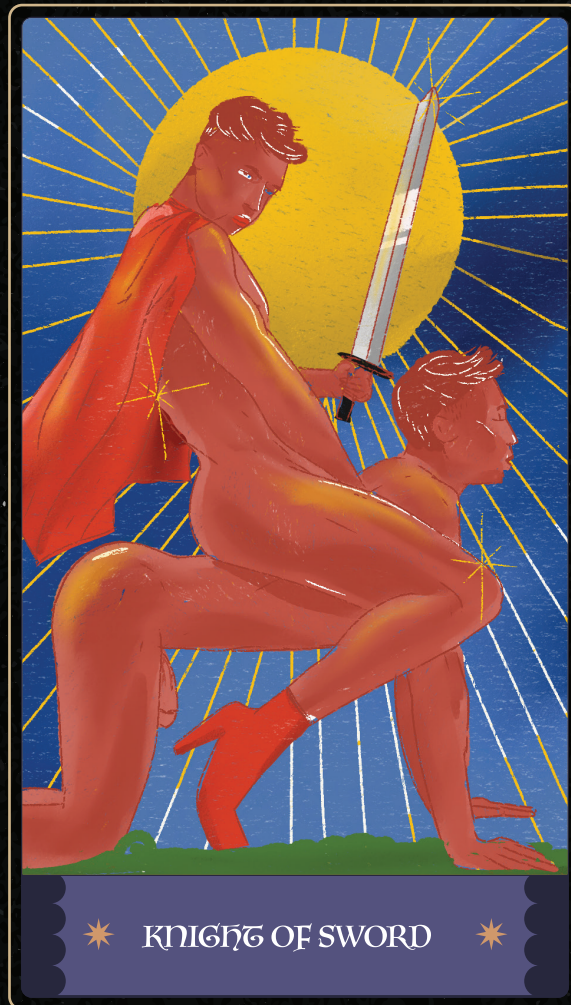

9. It Gets Better:

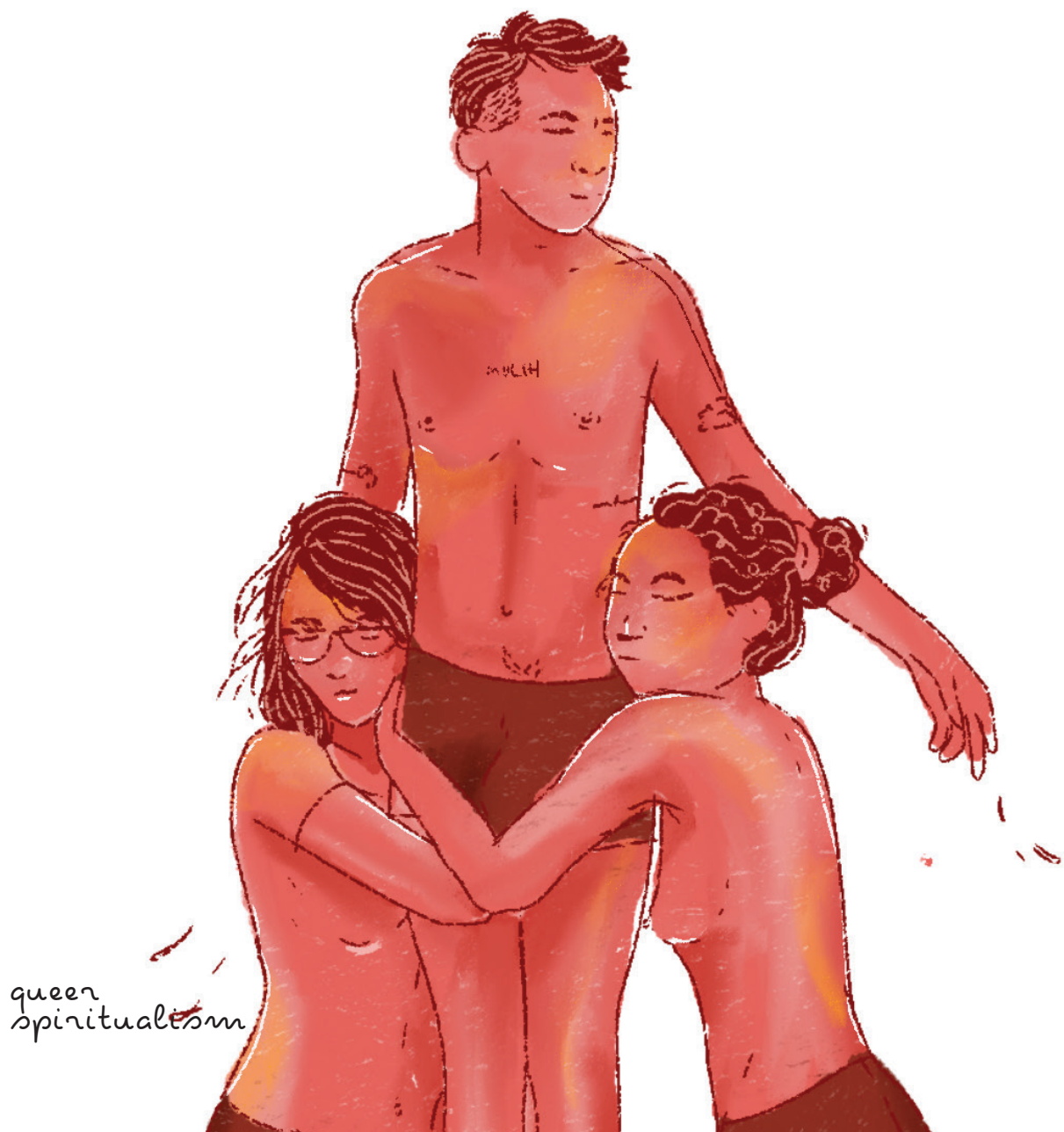
